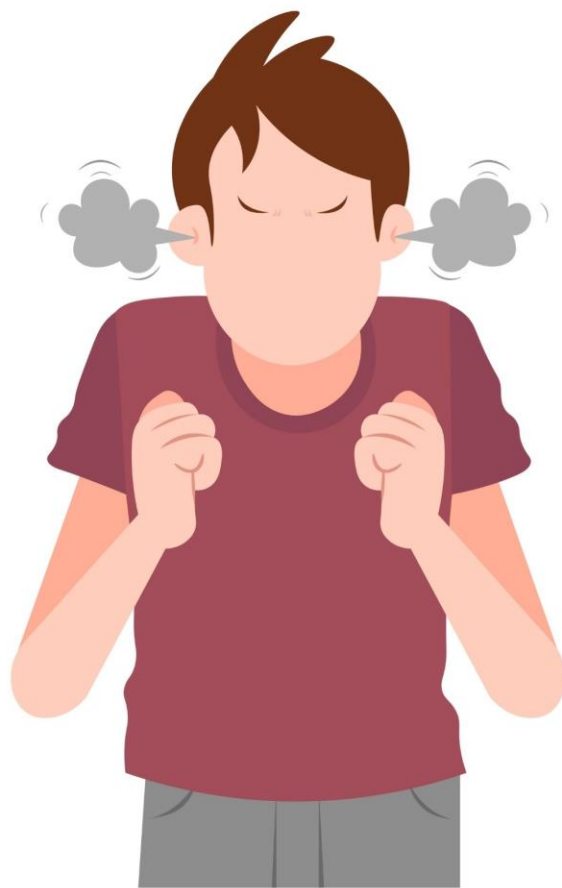

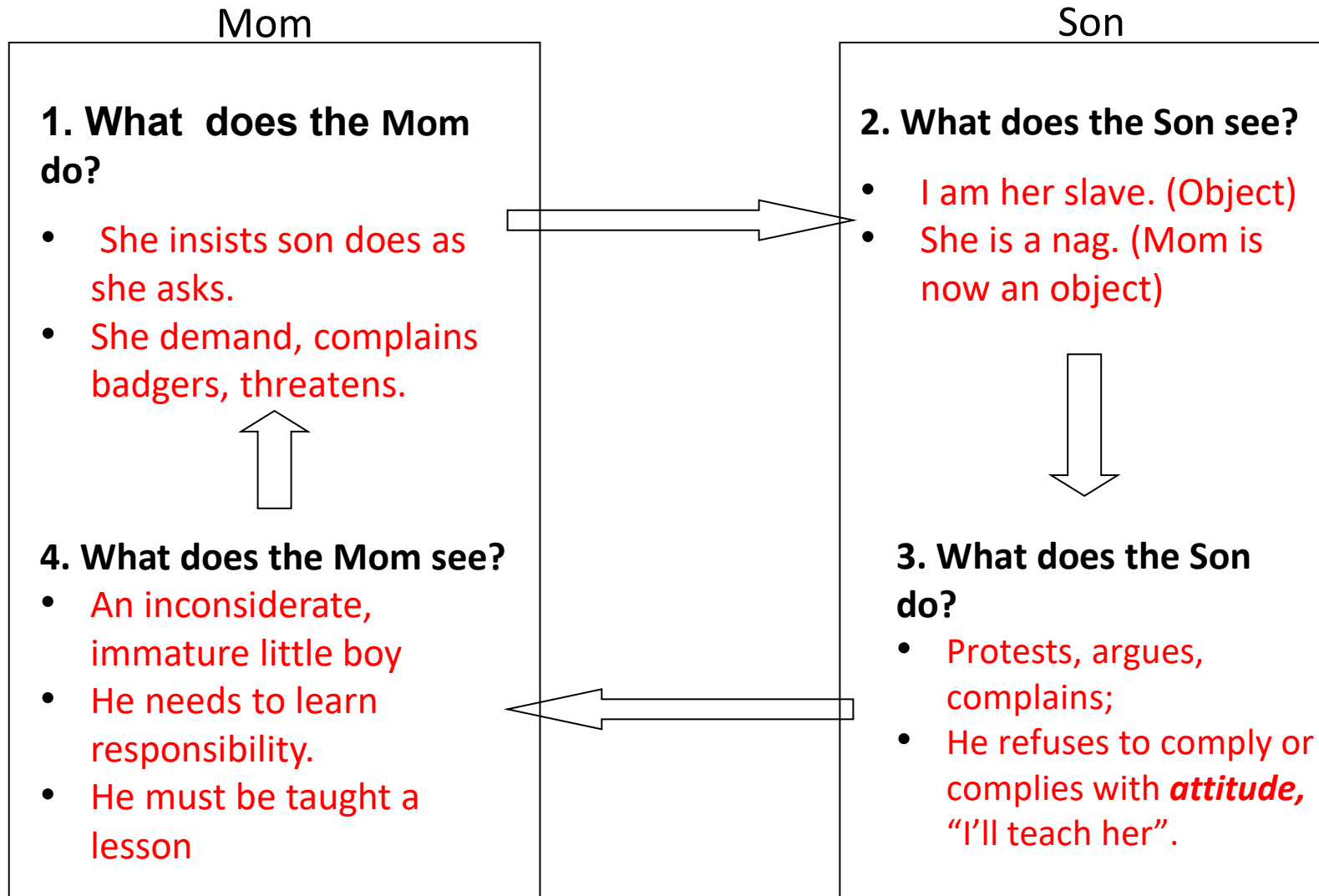

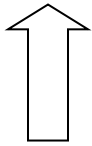
#1 Proclamation of 1763

- They forbid the colonists from migrating over the Appalachian Mountains to save money.

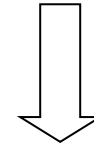


4. What does the Crown see?

- Disobedient subjects, who must be forced to obey by sending British troops to Force them.

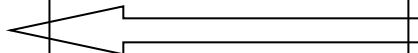
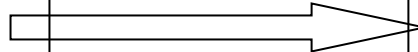
2. What do the colonies see?

- They move anyway ignoring the proclamation

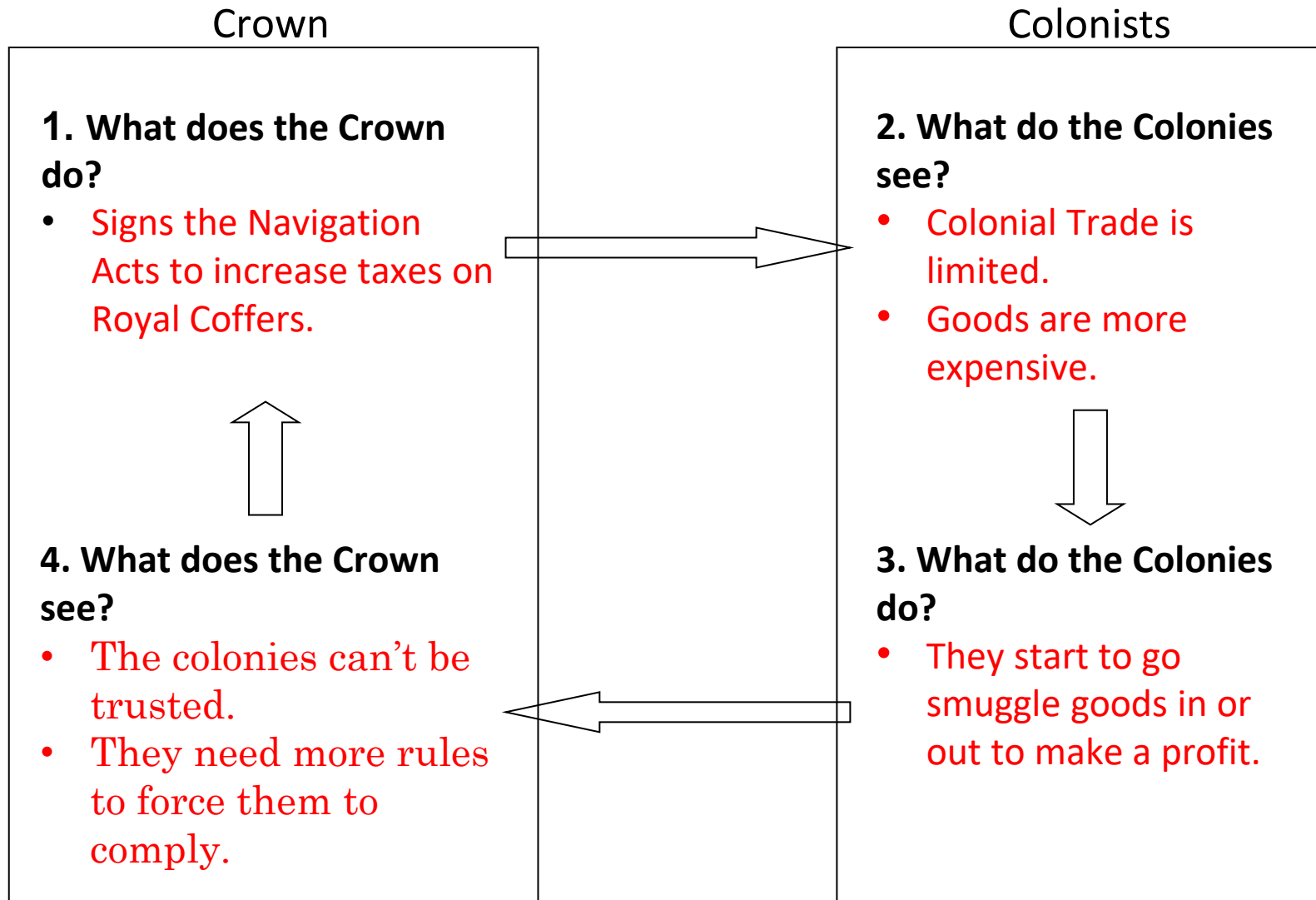

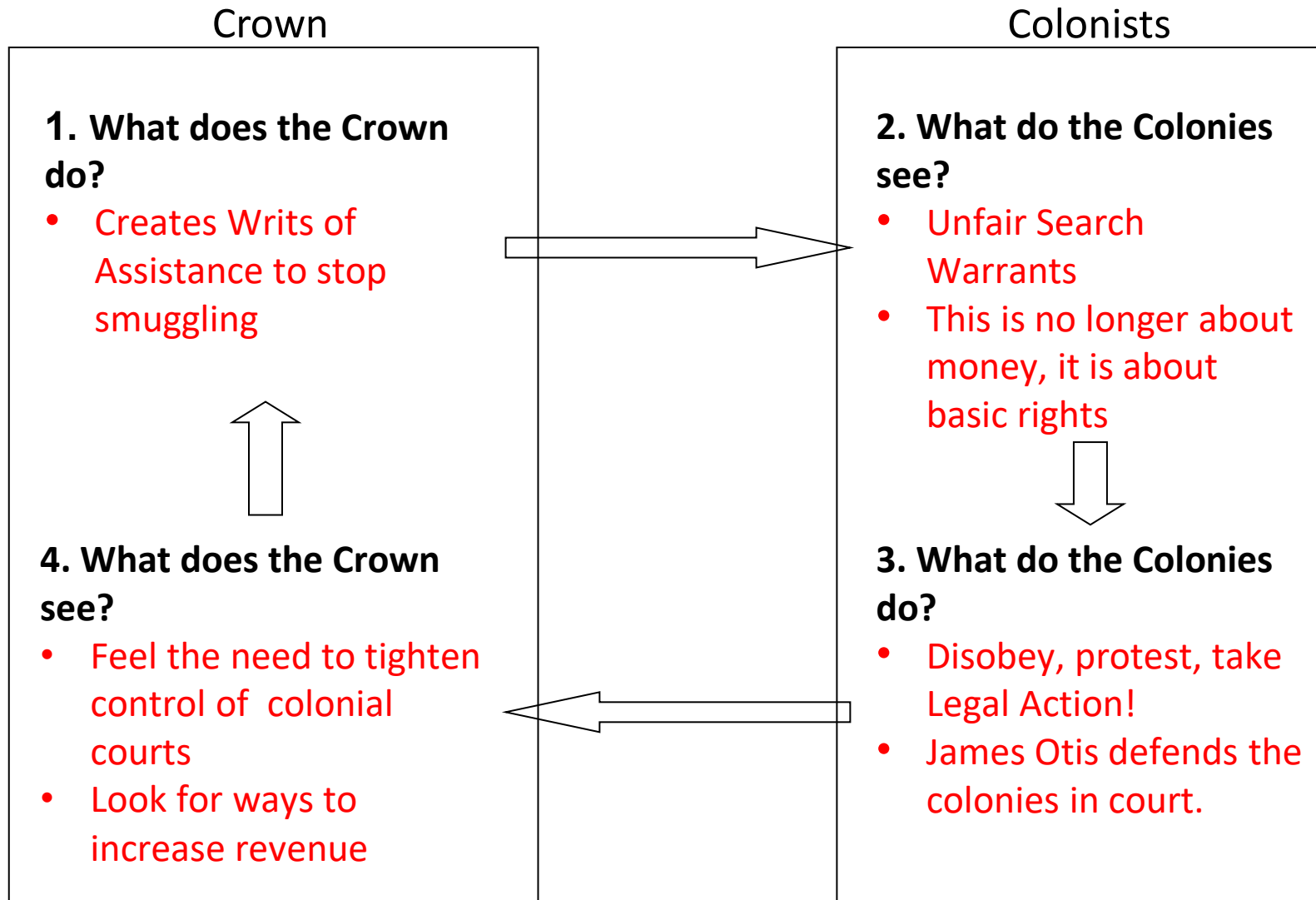
The Collusion Diagram

#3 Writs of Assistance

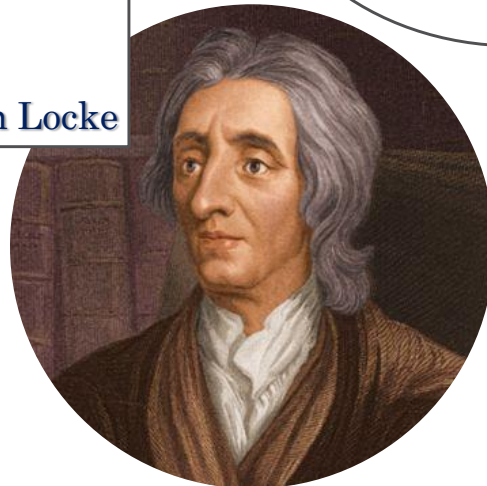


THE WRITS OF ASSISTANCE

1. What does the Crown do?

Enforces the Sugar Act by:

- burdens of paperwork on ship captains
- courts without juries
- the burden of proof on the defendant

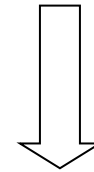


4. What does the Crown see?

- The colonists still aren't paying their fair share.

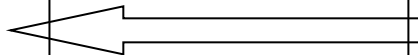
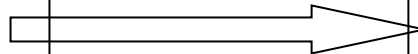
2. What do the Colonies see?

- The Crown is taking away our equal rights in the courts.



3. What do the Colonies do?

- Written protests, boycotts
- Cries of "No taxation without representation"

the American colonists.

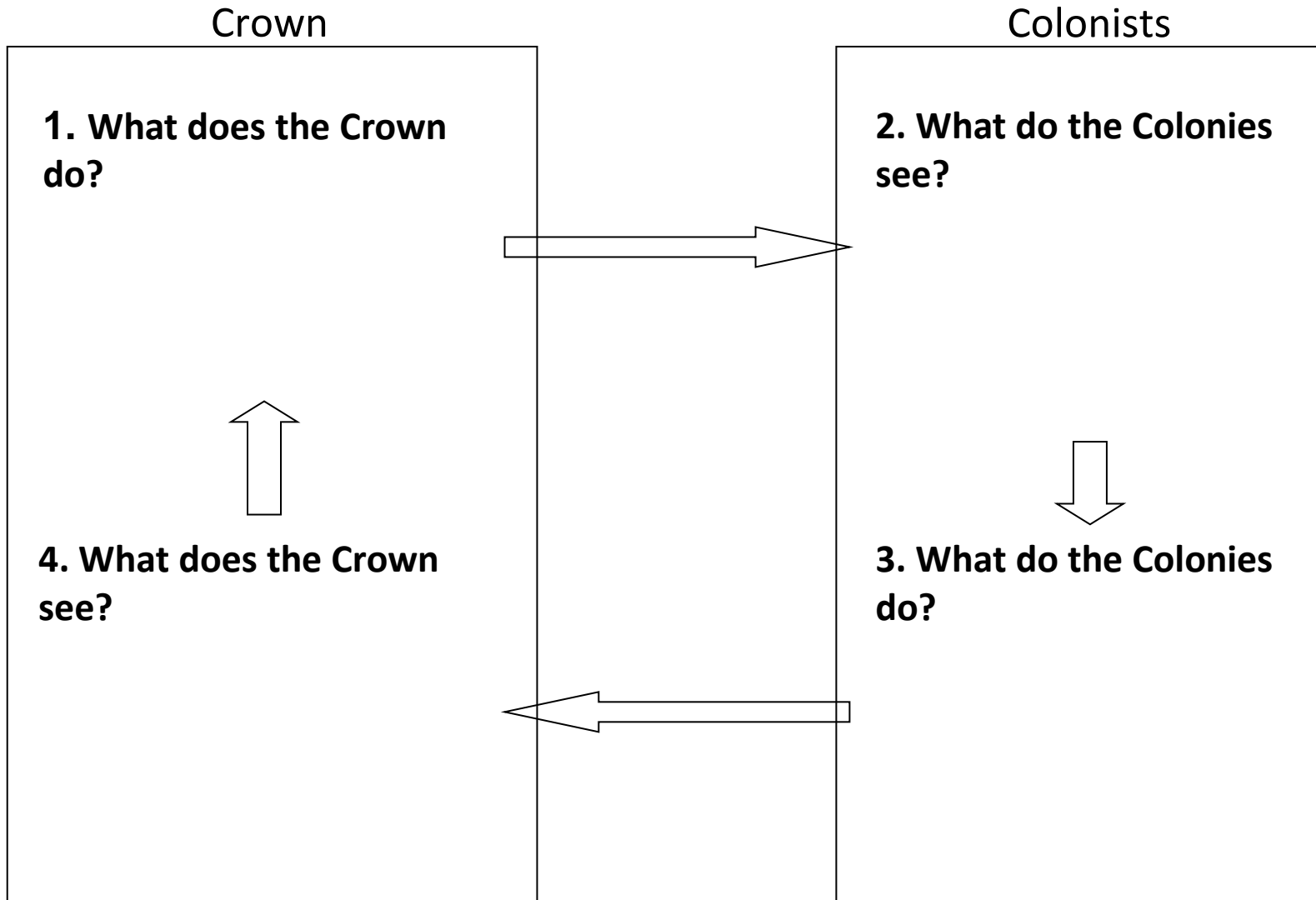

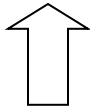
#6 King and Colonies

Colonists

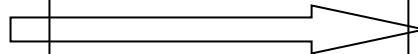
1. What does the Crown do.

- King allows Parliament to repeal the Stamp Act, **BUT...**
- issues the Declaratory Act "...we have full authority ... in all cases whatsoever."



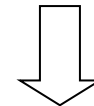
4. What does the Crown see?

- The Colonies **WILL** submit to our authority and pay their fair share!



2. What do the Colonies see?

- **We beat them!**
No taxation without representation.



3. What do the Colonies do?

- Celebrate & congratulate each other. Some think the crisis is past, others think this might just be a lull in the storm.
